Presidents Message

Welcome to the 146th Crystal Brook Show, as I write this in 2025 our community has been gripped by the driest 18 month period on record. But once again we put our best foot forward to brush the dust off and continue a tradition that has surpassed nearly a century and a half.

In 1874, the first Crystal Brook Show was held, a ploughing match to show the finest horses. The show grew from strength to strength and in 1900 the show moved to its current location to be close to the railway line so that patrons could attend the show via train. The show has run every year since its inception in 1874 aside from 1942, 1943 and 1944 where the show was abandoned due to World War II, and in 2020 and 2021, where unfortunately the Covid Pandemic forced the reluctant cancellation of our show.

We are very excited to have some new entertainment in 2025, the South Australian Parkour Association will be conducting demonstrations throughout the day. The hub area continues to grow with the introduction of wine tastings and cheese platters available from late afternoon. Live music will entertain the crowd throughout the day.

This year the committee has endeavoured to improve the layout for attendees. Once again, we will have Kemmy's Red Brick Trail bags, a low-cost activity for families to explore the show grounds and receive a bag full of goodies in the process. A massive thank you must go to the entertainment subcommittee for the organisation of this feature and the Girl Guides for assisting in the sites across the grounds. Other free activities include a massive sand pit, oversized games, crafting activities, Animals Anonymous, the Petting Zoo and giant bubbles. And for the teens and keen adults, this year we bring you the Mechanical Bull!

There have been some major changes to our Prime Lamb section, with exhibitors decorating their pens in their team colours. Best decorated pen will receive a \$450 reward for their club. How great it feels to be able to pay it forward to other local community organisations. The led steer classes have also been improved with changes to the classes and increased prize money.

A show of this magnitude cannot go on without the tireless efforts of the organising committee. I feel honoured to be part of such a strong and willing team that enthusiastically come together to organise this huge community event. Thankyou also to all the show convenors, without you, none of our indoor/ outdoor exhibits are possible. The time and effort you all put into make your sections what they are on show day is truly amazing.

This day is not possible without our kind sponsors, listed throughout the show book. We are grateful for your willingness to contribute and support our local show. Thank you to all the trophy and prize donors, members, exhibitors, judges, stewards and volunteers across the showground. You all play a significant role in bringing this wonderful community event to life.

Key Dates, Office Times & How to Enter the Show

Whether you're entering your best sponge cake, prize chook, painting, or broccoli — we've made the entry process as simple as possible with **Showday Online**. Here's everything you need to know to get started:

How to Enter the Show – Step-by-Step

1. **Create or Log In to Your Showday Online Account**

Head to the [Crystal Brook Show website](#) and select [How to Show](#). Set up your Showday Online account (or log in if you already have one).

2. **Choose Your Sections and Classes**

Browse all the categories — from cooking and craft to livestock and produce — and select the classes you want to enter.

3. **Fill Out Your Entry Details**

Double-check your information, especially your name, contact details, and age if you're entering a junior class.

4. **Buy Your Show Tickets**

Everyone attending the Show (including exhibitors) must have a valid entry ticket. You can purchase tickets while entering online.

5. **Pay Your Entry Fees**

Complete your payment securely through Showday Online. Entries won't be accepted without payment.

Note: Most junior sections are free to enter!

6. **Check Your Email**

After submitting, you'll receive a confirmation email (don't forget to check your junk/spam folder). Once accepted, you'll receive another email with your exhibit cards or digital entry ticket.

Important Tips for a Smooth Entry

- **Entry closing dates apply!** Check your section and enter early to avoid missing out.
- As per Show regulations, a **maximum of three entries per person per class** is permitted, unless otherwise specified.
- Before entering, take a moment to **review the conditions of entry for your section**. These often include helpful hints, tips, and guidelines that can give your entry the best chance of success. It'll also tell you delivery times and display rules.
- **Print and attach your exhibit cards** (if required) before dropping off your entries.

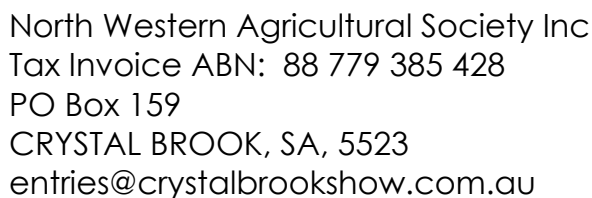

Conditions of entry

1. Late entries will incur an additional \$25 fee per horse and will be accepted at the discretion of the OC
2. Specified ages are the age of the rider on the day of the show
3. Horses may be Hack, or Hunter but not both
4. All exhibitors must:
 - submit all entries online, link to Show Day Online available via crystalbrookshow.com.au
 - hold current membership with the North Western Agricultural Society Inc (NWAS). Showday only membership for livestock entrants is \$15 and includes a ticket for 1 adult, and 1 vehicle
 - understand for entries to be accepted, the exhibitor must supply their PIC number, complete applicable waiver form and pay all appropriate fees prior to Show Day. Applicable waiver forms are available on Showday Online and should be forward to entries@crystalbrookshow.com.au
 - ensure their horses comply with regulations regarding measuring and certificates, and produce compliance if requested by an authorised Society representative
 - not allow their horses to be lunged on the oval, or golfing green
 - be suitably attired and wearing an appropriate helmet when riding at any time

Other notes:

- Judges are to be determined. Will be updated on Showday Online when confirmed.
- In the spirit of good sportsmanship, it is expected that once a competitor in the Ring has come First in two qualifying classes, they do not contest any further classes
- Crystal Brook Show is affiliated with Equestrian Australia (EA), however non-EA riders are encouraged to enter
- Supreme will be judged at the conclusion of all rings.
- Protests must be in writing and accompanied with a fee of \$50, lodged within 15 minutes of completion of the in question. If the protest is upheld the fee will be refunded; if dismissed it will be forfeited.
- If entrant numbers are low, there will be only one ring judged. Competitors needing extra qualifications will be judged by the ring one judge, but only in the classes that are needed.
- At the discretion of the NWAS Committee, if entrant numbers are low, Horses in Action will be cancelled. Exhibitors will be informed at close of entries and any entry fees paid will be fully refunded.

North Western Agricultural Society Inc Regulations

1. A subscriber of \$40 (Family) is entitled to tickets for two adults, three children (5-17 years) and 1 Vehicle.
2. A subscriber of \$30 (Dual) is entitled to tickets for two adults and one vehicle.
3. A subscriber of \$20 (Single) is entitled to tickets for one adult and one vehicle.
4. Junior membership is available for \$5 which provides 1 ticker (5-17 years)
5. Entry fee will vary from Free (junior pavilion classes) to \$25.
6. Those entering livestock competitions i.e. X Horses, S Sheep, V & W Cattle must be financial members on Show Day (Poultry exhibitors exempted). Show Day only membership is available for \$15
7. Prices for admission to Show Grounds on day of Show: Members and Subscribers free on presentation of tickets, Adults \$20 per day; Concession \$15 per day (on presentation of card) Children 5-17 years of age \$8 per day, Pre-school children free. Cash will not be accepted at the gate on the day of the Show.
8. The President or an Officer appointed by the Society may withdraw an Exhibit from being judged, without any reason being given.
9. As soon as the Judge's decision is given, the name of the Exhibitor may be placed on the exhibit, and if same is for sale, a price may be fixed thereto, or the time specified when it will be sold.
10. No person or persons will be admitted to the Pavilion, Yards, Tents, or Show Ring nor enclosure roped off space while the Articles or Stock are being judged, except one person in charge of Horses, Committee and Judges, the two latter of whom shall wear distinct badges.
11. No Exhibitor or their agent shall have personal communication with the Judges while in the execution of their duties, on it being proved that such communication has been held the Exhibitor may be disqualified. Should any information be required by the Judges, it must be obtained through the Stewards or through the Secretary.
12. Any Exhibitor or attendant with an exhibit giving annoyance to the Judges, or making use of insulting language to the Committee, Judges or Officials, shall be liable to have his exhibits disqualified, and/or be expelled from the grounds.
13. Entries for all exhibits for the Show received by the Secretary or the Society are subject to the approval of the Committee, who may decline to accept such entry without assigning any reason for doing so. Entries for exhibits in all classes are received by the Society only on the express condition that the Exhibitors agree to abide by the decisions of the judges, Stewards or Committee. The decisions and awards made and given are final and not subject to any action at law.
14. Judges are empowered to withhold prizes where exhibits are considered unworthy or considered to be non-bona fide owned by the exhibitor. The Judge's decision to be final.
15. The Public must leave the pavilion at 4.30pm after which time only exhibitors will be admitted for removal of exhibits.
16. **No Stock or other exhibit to be removed until 4.30pm** and any exhibit leaving the ground before that time without the permission of the Secretary may be disqualified.
17. No Stock or other exhibit to be sold by auction on the ground unless it has been shown for the competition and not until 4.30pm, and by permission of the committee.
18. All Sideshows, including Pugilistic Shows, will be under the control of the Showmen's Guild of South Australia, under terms and conditions mutually agreed upon. The Society reserves the right to refuse any persons a stand or stall without assigning any reason for doing so.
19. All stand, stall and sideshows must have pegs on tents etc., adequately covered to protect the public.
20. No second-hand Vehicles or Machinery shall be exhibited for sale.
21. The President, Secretary or an appointed Officer of the Society, shall have power to enter and Sideshow at any time they wish, free of charge.
22. An area to be decided by the Committee will be allotted to applicants on which to display Machinery, Motors or other Goods. A charge for the first such Block OUTDOORS will be \$100 (9mx6m), \$85 (6mx6m) or \$65 (3mx3m). Four large Machinery OUTDOOR blocks available for \$600. OUTDOOR food truck (including mobile coffee) available for \$250 (6mx6m), or \$200 (3mx3m) INSIDE the Trade Hall will be \$120 (3m x 3m).
23. Electricity use per outlet \$20.
24. All Cars must be parked where directed by Officials, however minimal onsite parking is available so first in first served will be applied.
25. All prizes will be paid on day of Show either as a Trophy, Cash or goods/voucher.
26. The dates named by closing entries will be strictly adhered to, subscriptions or entry fees must be paid before or when entries are made.
27. Any Exhibitor giving a wrong description of their exhibit with the intentions of deceiving the Society shall render such exhibit or exhibits liable to disqualification, and the prize or prizes (if any) liable to forfeiture, and may be debarred from exhibiting at any future show, and Exhibitors may be requested to make statutory declaration regarding their exhibits if the Committee so desires.
28. Protests in all cases must be in writing, and must be accompanied by a deposit with the Secretary of a sum representing half the value of the Prize (with a maximum amount of \$10.00) awarded by the Judge, and may be forfeited if protest is not upheld. Protests must be lodged, with the Secretary within one hour after judging.
29. No responsibility shall rest on, and no liability shall be incurred by the Society in respect to any event connected with the Show.
30. The Society will not under any circumstances hold itself liable for any accident on the ground

- or premises.
31. The Society will not under any circumstances hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to, or any miss-delivery of any exhibits, but every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits.
 32. Any exhibitor or Attendant refusing to attach the prize card or ribbon to any exhibit to which a prize is awarded and to keep the same on during the show, may be disqualified from again competing. No exhibitor will be allowed to display any Prize-Card or Ribbon on an exhibit, stall or stand, other than those issued by the Society for the current year until the judging of that Section has been completed.
 33. All Exhibitors must place their exhibits in the space allotted to them by the Stewards in charge of the Class, and no exhibit or portion of same shall afterwards be removed or substituted, under penalty of disqualification.
 34. Exhibitors or their agents must if requested point out to the Stewards their respective exhibits, in order that they may be identified, classified, and numbered according to the Catalogue before being submitted to the Judges.
 35. Any prize awarded by the Judge which may be withheld in consequence of a valid protest, may be awarded to the exhibit next in order of merit.
 36. Should any exhibit having gained a prize be disqualified, the next in order of merit does not necessarily obtain the prize. The Committee with or without the advice of the Judge shall decide the question.
 37. Should there be any reason to suspect that any exhibit is either diseased or dangerous, the Society reserve the right of refusing admittance to or removing the same from the ground at the expense of the Exhibitor.
 38. All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the Judges appointed by the Society as to the merits of their exhibits, and in the case of protests alleging infringement of the Regulations, the decision of the Committee shall be accepted as final, except on appeal to the Northern Agricultural Shows Association.
 39. No entry will be received from any person disqualified by this Society, or by the Northern Agricultural Societies Association during the period of such disqualifications, and should any entry be accidentally accepted, it shall when discovered be deemed void and the entry fee may be forfeited.
 40. Any matter not dealt with shall be decided by the Committee concerned, whose decisions shall be final. Five to form a quorum.
 41. Cups and Trophies which must be won more than once shall remain in custody of the Society until the winner determined.
 42. Any conditions or regulations printed in this prize list under the various Sectional headings are to be construed as part of the regulations governing the conduct of the Show of the Society and equally binding on Exhibitors.
 43. All applications for connection to the electricity supply must be approved by the President or his/her nominee.
 44. No exhibit having taken a First Prize will be allowed to compete in any other Class, unless otherwise provided for.
 45. The Judges are empowered to decide upon the age of any animal exhibit in any class. Age of horse to date from 1st August.
 46. In the absence of exhibitor limits within the Section's Conditions of Entry, no exhibitor will be allowed to make more than three Entries in one class.
 47. No cheques outstanding over two years will be honoured by the Society.
 48. In the event of a tie, the final decision will be awarded on a count-back.
 49. Any unauthorized person found on grounds after dark on Friday or Saturday of the Show will be prosecuted.

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
